

Dear Readers,

With apologies to Alfred Lord Tennyson:

In the spring a young man's fancy lightly turns to thoughts of adhering to his clotting factor prophylaxis regimen to limit his bleeding and complications.

This month's issue highlights the Pharmacy at Cascade. We'll look at importance of adherence to your treatment plan and guidelines for proper storage of your factor. Please take a quick minute to meet our pharmacy staff. We're the ones you chat with when you call in your order. We are happy to be a part of your care team.

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To Adhere or Not to Adhere? That is the Question

Adherence to your prophylaxis treatment plan is obviously important in limiting your breakthrough bleeding and other complications.

As with any medication, following the prescribed plan has been shown to improve outcomes. Studies have shown that patients who closely follow their treatment plan have decreased numbers of breakthrough bleeds and lower pain scores than those who do not. Data also shows patients who closely follow their regimen have fewer missed work/school days than those who do not.

Also, many insurance companies are becoming more interested in how closely their customers are following their prescriptions. They require us to gather specific information prior to shipping your order. That's why we are asking about the number of doses you have on hand and if you've had any recent bleeds.

Keeping Your Factor Safely Stored

Because of its high cost, it is very important to store your clotting factor under the proper conditions. At Cascade we keep all the clotting factor in commercial refrigerators that have been further modified to maintain recommended storage conditions. Additionally, we have two systems that monitor the refrigerators (24 hours/day) and notify us if anything goes outside of the recommended temperatures.

Luckily for you, if your refrigerator is working properly, you already have the perfect place to store factor at home! For clarification, the official definition of refrigeration temperature is 36-46°F (2-8°C) and room temperature is generally considered up to 77°F (25°C).

Did you know that many clotting factor products can be stored at room temperature? For most products this decreases the "shelf-life" of the factor and it can only be stored at room temperature for a specific period of time. For those products you'll usually see a spot on the box where you can write down the date you removed the factor from refrigeration to make sure you use it within the new, shortened, timeline.

On the chart to the right, we have compiled manufacturer information about how long products can be stored at room temperature. It is important to note that for most products, once the factor has come up to room temperature you should not place it back into the fridge. And keep in mind the room temperature date will never extend the product past the original expiration date on the box. You can't cheat the system by taking factor out of the fridge the day before it expires and get 6 more months!



What in the World Is a Delivery Ticket?

When you open your FedEx box from Cascade, there is a very important piece of paper inside which outlines the prescriptions and supplies you have ordered. It's called a "Delivery Ticket" and is very similar to the signature required at your local drug store. Because we aren't seeing you in person, we require your signature by mail.

Why is This So Important?

- ✓ It is required by your insurance company; and,
- ✓ It's proof to them we did actually send you an expensive drug (and not a 50 cent box of Band-Aids)
