As a non-profit 340B factor program, you can feel good that your choice benefits the bleeding disorder community in significant ways.

Primary goal: provide excellent and ethical services

Cascade's primary goal is to provide excellent and ethical services to our patients while ensuring our 340B savings are passed on to you.

In 1994, the Hemophilia Foundation of Michigan (HFM) and a group of community members developed Cascade as a self-governing, non-profit organization. Shortly after Cascade's incorporation, we were granted status as a 340B covered entity.

What is the 340B Program?

The 340B Drug Discount Program is a federal government program created in 1992 that requires drug manufacturers to provide outpatient drugs to eligible health care organizations and covered entities at significantly reduced prices. The income generated by these discounts allow us and other covered entities to support and expand access to comprehensive care/services to the bleeding disorders community.

Secondary goal: support patient care and education

Our second goal is to support patient care and education in our region. We do this by utilizing all revenue after expenses to provide financial support and services to our region's HTC's and Chapter Foundations. We support and partner with the HTC's and Foundations to provide direct patient care, educational conferences/events and emergency financial assistance for patients like you. By choosing Cascade as your provider, you have helped to provide over \$68 million in total to the bleeding disorder community since 1997.

Each year, the Hemophilia Treatment Centers and bleeding disorder foundations throughout Michigan, Indiana, and Ohio receive financial support from Cascade.
