

IMPORTANT MEDICAID INFORMATION Protect Your Coverage

In the beginning of the COVID pandemic, the federal government enacted a federal Public Health Emergency (PHE) that placed a hold on all Medicaid renewals. This helped prevent Medicaid beneficiaries from losing their health care coverage during the pandemic.

The Public Health Emergency has ended, and Michigan Medicaid has been preparing to restart Medicaid eligibility renewals. This means that <u>everyone</u> on Medicaid will need to be re-evaluated in order to keep their Medicaid coverage active.

If you are currently on Medicaid, you will receive renewal information and paperwork 3 months prior to your renewal date beginning in June, 2023. If your renewal is in June, you should receive an awareness letter in March and the renewal packet shortly afterward.

What to do now:

- Visit Michigan.gov/MIBridges, and log-in to your account.
- Make sure your address, phone number, and email address are up to date.
- Check your mail and your MIBridges site regularly and keep all information current.
- When you get a renewal packet, be sure to fill it out and return it by the due date with the required paperwork.
- You can check your renewal date by clicking on the "View Benefits" module on the Michigan.gov/MIBridges site.

NOTE: If you do not complete and return the renewal information by the required deadline, you may lose your Medicaid coverage.
